# INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Biology of Birds

Course Abbreviation and Number: BIO 1520 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** In this introduction to birds, one of the most colorful and popular groups of animals on our planet, students will learn about basic anatomy and physiology, evolutionary history, classification and identification by sight and song, behavior, and ecological importance. Outdoor fieldwork is included.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or Corequisite: ENG 1510 with supports.
