Powers Takes JCC Education Around The World

Daniel Powers, '84, decided to attend Jamestown Community College out of high school for the same reasons many students do.

“It allowed me to attend college in my hometown, save money, live at home and get a great education before I went on to a four-year program,” he said.

That education Powers received at JCC became the foundation for a career that has taken him all over the globe. Today, he has more than 20 years of experience in technology and leadership executive positions at corporations including IBM and Amazon. He presently works as the vice president of web services sales worldwide at Amazon.com.

Powers said the two years he spent at JCC, arriving on a theater scholarship, gave him “a great base of education to grow off.” It got him started on an academic path that led him to a bachelor’s degree in computer science and mathematics from Rochester Institute of Technology and an MBA from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania.

“The class sizes were small, the professors always had time for you, and there was a great spirit of still being part of the community in town,” Powers said. “Other schools didn’t offer that same level of intimacy, but JCC prepared me for those courses by helping me to develop great study habits and a strong base of education to do well.”

Recently returning to the college to deliver the 2011 commencement speech, Powers shared his four keys to



being successful: passion, flexibility, networking, and learning. Flexibility may be the most important one to Powers in his line of work - he has moved 18 times since graduating college - but he stressed for students that learning should be a lifelong process, not one that ended when they finished their coursework at JCC.

He said that their experience at JCC, however, will help them a great deal as they continue that process throughout the remainder of their lives.

“I hope they realize that it was a great two years to spend at JCC, as they should have gotten - as I did - a higher quality educational experience than they will get at larger four-year schools,” Powers said. “They got that education at a fraction of the cost, with the ability to still be around family and friends. All that adds up to the reasons why JCC is a great choice.”

Three Receive the 2011 Distinguished Alumnus Award at Commencement

Daniel A. Powers, Dominic Rogers and Kevin A. Saff received the 2011 Distinguished Alumnus Award. Presented by the JCC Alumni Association, the award recognizes graduates who have distinguished themselves in their careers and/or in service to their communities.

Cattaraugus County Campus

Dominic P. Rogers received the Distinguished Alumnus Award at the Cattaraugus County Campus commencement ceremony on Friday, May 20. Rogers, the information technology director at Cutco Corporation, graduated from JCC in 1991 with an associate’s degree in computer science. He earned a bachelor’s degree at the University of Pittsburgh and is pursuing a master’s degree at St. Bonaventure University.

Rogers, a 2010 Leadership Cattaraugus graduate, serves on the boards of directors of University Primary Care and the JCC Foundation. He has volunteered for the YMCA, Salvation Army, Challenger Learning Center, St. John’s Roman Catholic Church, and the Olean Little League, girls’ softball, and recreational basketball programs.

Jamestown Campus

Two alumni received the Distinguished Alumnus Award at the Jamestown campus commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 21. Daniel A. Powers, vice president of worldwide sales and business development for Amazon.com, graduated from JCC in 1984. He earned a bachelor’s degree at the Rochester Institute of Technology and a master’s degree in business administration at the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania.

Powers has focused his career on advanced technologies, business strategy, and information technology infrastructures. He is also a renowned presenter on cloud computing, security, service oriented architecture (SOA), open systems, Linux, and the open source movement.

Prior to joining Amazon’s web services and cloud computing business last year, Powers led several strategic initiatives for IBM in security, cloud and grid computing, SOA, marketing, and mergers and acquisitions.

Powers is the founder of World Community Grid, which allows PC users to donate their spare CPU cycles to work on projects that benefit humanity. More than 500,000 volunteers have contributed enough computer power to make it the largest volunteer effort of its kind worldwide.

10,000 MANIACS

30 Years Since Birth At JCC

Steve Gustafson says he gets goosebumps just thinking about what developed during his time at Jamestown Community College.

Through his involvement with JCC's radio station WJWK while attending the college in the late 1970s and early 1980s, something magical developed - something that would take him on the ride of his life.

"I'd say JCC, and the radio station in particular, was the confluence that sort of brought the band together," said Gustafson, bass guitarist for the 10,000 Maniacs. "I like to define my career, or at least my memories of the band's career, as sort of happy accidents that happened."

Those "happy accidents" began when Gustafson and fellow JCC student Dennis Drew were working together at WJWK, under the guidance of advisers John Heister and Ed Tomassini. The work was inspiring to them as young music lovers, Drew said, and the college provided a great atmosphere for them to culture their creativity.

"It really was all because of JCC and the staff that was down there then," Drew said. "It was just a great bunch of people who helped get that music scene started."

Gustafson and Drew were soon joined at the station by a young girl named Natalie Merchant, who began producing a show that was heard by a young man named Rob Buck. Buck was so intrigued by the music being played on the station while he worked at Hope's Windows in Jamestown that he enrolled in the college and began working at the station himself.

Record companies were sending the station music that normally wouldn't be heard in Jamestown, Gustafson said, "crazy new music" such as The Sex Pistols, The Gang of Four, and The Clash. The group of friends embraced the musical style, but the student body "hated it," Gustafson said. However, the staff at JCC stood behind the radio station's musical choices.

"(The college) was very supportive of what we were doing, because we were trying, we were advocating things, we were standing up for what we believed in," Gustafson said. "We weren't just sitting around the Student Union, staring at the TV."

Soon the friends decided they wanted to form their own band, and they did so in 1981 under the name Still Life. The rock 'n' roll life came quickly: they were thrown out of the bar after their debut gig in Erie, Gustafson said, and they were hooked on the life.

The band soon changed its name to 10,000 Maniacs, and it wasn't long before they got huge, first hitting it big in the United Kingdom in 1983 and later charting several hit albums and singles in the United States. Among other highlights of their career, they recorded an MTV Unplugged session and played President Clinton's inaugural ball in 1993.

Today, Gustafson and Drew are the only remaining original members of the band. In addition to playing with the group, Drew is the general manager of public radio station WRFA in Jamestown, while Gustafson has come full circle and works at JCC as a music instructor and technical director of Scharmann Theatre.

The college has continued to support the band throughout its 30 years of existence, both said. The band has played every venue the campus has to offer, and the band will be featured as part of the Weeks Gallery's "Homegrown Excellence II" show in October, including a special concert in the Scharmann Theatre on October 1.

"It's always been a part of this community, and we always feel like we've been a part of JCC," Drew said. "It's always been close to us."

The 10,000 Maniacs' October 1 concert begins at 7:30 p.m., preceded by an optional meet and greet session which will include a champagne toast and group photograph in the Weeks Gallery at 6:15 p.m.

Powers led many businesses and strategic initiatives for IBM, including the company's cloud sales teams, security solutions worldwide, systems group mergers and acquisitions, service-oriented architecture sales and technical sales, Asia Pacific WebSphere business, and cloud/grid computing and Linux strategies and sales.

He also is the founder of World Community Grid, a grid for good that allows PC users to donate their spare CPU cycles to work on projects that help the planet. More than half a million volunteers have registered more than one million computers to the cause.

During JCC's commencement ceremony in May, he received the Distinguished Alumnus Award. He was nominated for the award by computer science professor Chuck Jackson, whose work ethic, passion for computer science, and attention to detail Powers said he has always remembered.

Powers said he has many fond memories from his days at the college. He had athletic glory, winning the New York State National Junior College Athletic Association track tournament in the 400-meter relay in JCC's first year with a track program, and he represented the school in the NJCAA nationals. He also remembers watching an unknown band with a radically dressed lead singer setting up on the lawn and playing just for fun - a band that eventually grew into world fame as the 10,000 Maniacs.

Most importantly, though, he said JCC taught him life lessons that he carries with him every day of his life, no matter where he job takes him in the world.

"What I gained from JCC is to always stay humble in life, and to work hard and have fun," Powers said.

Brenda Baer, a 2006 graduate and a nurse manager for the in-patient health unit at Charles Cole Memorial Hospital, has accepted a new position as assistant nurse manager for the geriatric psychiatric unit. Ms. Baer recently received her ANCC certification in psychiatric nursing.

After graduating from JCC in 1989, **Linda Chase** became a registered nurse at Warren General Hospital. She joined Hospice of Warren County in 1992, and has been praised as a knowledgeable hospice and palliative care nurse. Ms. Chase is the RN supervisor of Hospice of Warren County's newly established hospice residence, where she has provided both managerial and clinical guidance.

JCC Remembers Two Community Leaders

Elizabeth Lenna Fairbank & Charles Price

The JCC college community noted with great sadness the deaths of two individuals who played important roles at the college, Elizabeth “Betty” Lenna Fairbank and Charles H. Price.

Mrs. Fairbank, a proud 1973 alumna of JCC, died on April 15, 2011. She was recognized by JCC with the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 1991 and the John D. Hamilton Award in 2005. The Lenna Teleconference Theatre in the Hultquist Library on the Jamestown Campus was named in honor of Mrs. Fairbank and her first husband, the late Reginald Lenna, in recognition of their commitment to and belief in the mission of JCC.

Mrs. Fairbank will be remembered for her gentle spirit and philanthropic passion for our community. Her impact on JCC and the diverse organizations she supported throughout the region will be felt for generations to come.

Mr. Price died on June 17, 2011. He served as a member of the JCC board of trustees from 1956-1968 and as chairperson from 1964-1968. He was named trustee emeritus in 1996 for his nine-year commitment to the board and his leadership with the JCC Foundation from its inception in 1981. The trustee emeritus designation has only been given twice in the college's history.

In 1996 Mr. Price became the first recipient of the John D. Hamilton Award, presented by the JCC Foundation for exceptional community service.

He was honored by the college again in 2010, when he received the John D. Hamilton Board Service Chair Award, given to current and former chairpersons of the JCC board of trustees. Mr. Price will be remembered for his exceptional leadership and for his steadfast guidance of the college over its history.

Alumni Profile: Jessica Goodell

Alumna's Book Sheds Light On Horrors Of War

When Jessica Goodell graduated high school, she chose not to go directly to college.

Instead, she chose the military route - a route that would lead her to Iraq, and to some of the most gruesome sights imaginable.

In her recently released book, *Shade It Black: Death and After In Iraq*, Goodell details her role as a member of the mortuary affairs unit in the war: the group of soldiers whose mission it is to process and identify the remains of dead American soldiers and Iraqi civilians.

Those experiences with death never escaped her while she was on her tour of duty with the Marine Corps, she said. When she returned home, she found she still couldn't get away from the sight and smell of death. Goodell suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder related to her experiences in the war. She enrolled at JCC upon her return home but didn't tell anyone about what she had done in Iraq and what she had seen.

"It was really difficult adjusting to civilian life," Goodell said. "I was older - although not by much - than the average student and I had traveled around the world, even seeing war, when many students had not even left their hometowns."

In the fall of 2006 she was enrolled in American Institutions, a sociology course taught by professor John Hearn, who noticed something different about the student.

"When I picture her in that classroom, it's her posture I see most clearly," writes Hearn in the postscript to *Shade It Black*, which he co-wrote. "While others had a tendency to slouch down into their plastic chairs or to lean forward to rest their arms on a shared table before them, Jess sat with a perfectly straight spine. She didn't whisper to classmates, play with her phone, or appear disinterested. She finished the course with one of a few A's I assigned. I remember, too, that she did not say a single word throughout the 15-week semester."

Goodell said that the American Institutions course prompted her to think about her place in society, and she told Hearn about what she had experienced and how she was struggling to readjust.

"At the time, I was struggling with flashbacks, nightmares, substance abuse, and social isolation," she said. "John suggested that I tell him everything I could remember about Iraq, and that he would write it down into a coherent narrative so that I could begin processing my experiences."

The two spent weeks talking, Goodell said. Though Goodell said it was difficult to answer Hearn's questions and put her memories of the experiences down onto paper, and that interviews often needed to be cut short because she would begin crying and shaking, doing so helped her to confront her fears and the horror of what she had been through.

But she couldn't do it right away. After about 90 pages were written, she said, Hearn gave her the documents and told her she should read them when she was ready. She placed them in a dresser drawer and left them there for close to two years, until she could face the memories.

"Finally, I pulled (them) out and called John and said I was ready," Goodell said. "We read it line by line and decided to see if we could get it published."

Since its publication in early 2011, *Shade It Black* has earned accolades for Goodell's comprehensive portrait of her experiences as a member of the military. Ranked as an Amazon.com bestseller in Iraqi history genre, *Shade It Black* has garnered excellent reviews from various sources. As W. Keith Campbell, Ph.D., a psychology professor at the University of Georgia notes, "*Shade It Black* is a powerful, direct, and honest account of one Marine's experiences in Iraq. It is a story of trauma and struggle, but also of integrity and ultimately growth. For me, the twin themes of trauma and posttraumatic growth in this book recalled Somerset Maugham's classic, *The Razor's Edge*."

Goodell plans to attend graduate school at the University at Buffalo in the fall of 2011 to continue her pursuit of a career in psychology, with the hope of one day working with veterans and their families. Currently, however, her book is doing the job of educating the world about how the hell of war can impact the psyche of a human being forever.

John J. Nalbone Sr. Scholarship Established

As a tribute to John J. Nalbone Sr.'s lifelong achievements in aviation and his commitment to education, the John Nalbone Sr. Scholarship has been established at the Jamestown Community College Foundation.

Created by Nalbone's family, the scholarship will benefit students in JCC's professional piloting program. To be eligible to apply for the scholarship, a student must be either a high school senior who intends to enter JCC's professional piloting program or be enrolled in the program and reside in Chautauqua County while participating in the piloting program.

To be eligible to receive the award, a student must have completed at least one semester of full-time study at JCC with a minimum grade point average of 3.0 and have completed the requisite courses for the professional piloting degree program to date.

Nalbone's interest in aviation began in childhood. Upon graduating from Jamestown High School in 1938, he received a scholarship for eight hours of flight time through the Civil Air Patrol. Subsequent funding through the Civilian Pilot Training Act resulted in Nalbone earning his commercial and flight instructor ratings by 1940. He was commissioned as a warrant officer in the Army Air Corps in 1942 and was assigned to primary flight instruction until 1945. During World War II, Nalbone trained others in primary, basic, advanced trainer, and pursuit aircraft operations.

After the war, he settled in Dunkirk where he established Werle Flight School at the former CAA Airmail Landing Field on Werle Road in Sheridan. The G.I. Bill helped hundreds of area veterans learn to fly at the school. In 1961 Nalbone moved his flight school operation to the abandoned Dunkirk Airport property where he founded Dunkirk Aviation. The business earned designations as a Federal Aviation Administration approved flight school and repair station.

By his retirement in 1991, Nalbone had administered over 3,000 pilot flight tests as a pilot examiner. He received the FAA Lifetime Achievement Award in 1996 for 55 years of contributions to aviation. As a result of his dedication, commitment, and love of aviation, countless individuals have successfully pursued their dream of flying. By establishing the scholarship in their father's honor, the Nalbone family hopes to perpetuate the spirit of the love of flying that John Nalbone Sr. has exemplified throughout his life.
