- Students who withdraw their registration from any or all classes shall be liable for payment of tuition and fees, and are eligible for refunds according to the following schedule:

	tuition liability	reduction of tuition charges
Prior to the first day of classes	0%	100%
1st week of semester (January 18-22) tuition and fee liability begins	25%	75%
2nd week of semester (January 25-29)	50%	50%
3rd week of semester (February 1-5)	75%	25%
4th week of semester and later (February 8 and later)	100%	0%

- Students participating in drop/add procedures during the first week of classes will not be assessed charges for dropped classes required for course schedule changes.
- Students who wish to withdraw from any or all of their classes are advised to file their course withdrawals promptly with the Counseling Center on the Cattaraugus County Campus, the registrar on the Jamestown Campus, or the main office at the North County and Warren centers. Students should consult with the financial aid and business offices *before* they stop attending classes.
- All refunds are based on the date withdrawal forms are completed and filed with the registrar's office. Exceptions to this policy will be considered under extenuating circumstances.
- Students who receive Title IV aid (PELL, ACG, SEOG, Stafford loans) and withdraw from all classes may have their awards reduced and will be responsible to repay any aid disbursed that they are subsequently ineligible to receive. Refunds are paid in the following order: Federal Stafford Loans (subsidized and unsubsidized), PLUS Loans, Pell, Academic Competitiveness, SEOG Grants, required refunds of other federal, state, private, or institutional assistance, to the student.
- Students may pay with valid Visa, MasterCard, or Discover charge cards. If mailing registration with credit card number, please be sure to include three-digit security code found on reverse side of card.

*Students must complete an affidavit for a certificate of residence that indicates permanent New York state residency for 12 months prior to the start of classes.

Payment Process for All Students

If you would like to view your bill online, you may do so once registration has opened for the spring 2010 semester by visiting <https://banner.sunyjcc.edu>. If you are:

- Expecting financial aid, funds you are eligible to receive will be applied to your student account after registration.
- Expecting financial aid to pay only a portion of your bill, you will receive a statement reflecting the status of your tuition and fee bill with your balance due. You may also pay online by visiting <https://banner.sunyjcc.edu>. For more information about paying your bill online, contact the business office at the campus you attend. If you are paying for your classes by cash, check, or MC/Visa/Discover, your payment must be received in the business office by January 8, 2010 for those students who pre-register by December 17, 2009. For those students who register on December 18, 2009 or later, please pay the bill by January 29, 2010.

Maintaining Eligibility for Financial Aid

Students enrolled at JCC are eligible to participate in a wide range of federal, state and institutional grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study programs. Students must be accepted and matriculated by the JCC admissions office and meet academic eligibility criteria to receive awarded funds. Start the application process for all sources of aid by filing the 2009-10 Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

In addition to meeting financial and academic eligibility requirements, students must meet federal and state citizenship and residency requirements and must not be in default of a federal student loan or owe a repayment of other federal student aid to receive awarded funds.

Students are encouraged to apply for funds from outside sources as well, such as private grants and scholarships, employee reimbursement plans, VESID, Native American aid, veteran's benefits, and workforce development and re-training programs.
