Decision Process:

Applications (including personal essays and reference forms) are due by November 1 for the following spring semester, and May 1 for the following fall semester.

Personal interviews and phone references will be conducted upon receipt of completed application.

One finalist and up to two stand-by applicants will complete state and federal background clearances, and will undergo child abuse prevention training.

Cleared and trained finalists will commence process of securing Chinese visas and air transportation, register for appropriate coursework for spring, and begin necessary training and preparation.
