Course Title: Painting I

Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2510 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will create paintings in a variety of media and concepts as well as gain understanding of the potential of a visual creator. Students work in watercolor, gouache, acrylic, and oil on paper supports and are required to produce a portfolio of paintings with evaluation based on technical growth and exploration of visual ideas.
