Course Title: Studio Production Practicum

Course Abbreviation and Number: CMM 2570

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students have the opportunity to expand the foundation of production skills acquired in CMM 1630. Producing, directing, writing for electronic media, and live editing skills are emphasized. Students will provide guidance and advice to production teams through live-to-tape programs and lab exercises.

Prerequisite: CMM 1630.

1. Demonstrate leadership skills as applied to planning, preparing and executing programs created in a television studio
 2. Execute faculty created lesson plans for simple studio lab exercises for students taking CMM 1630
 3. Demonstrate advanced understanding of studio productions, especially producing and directing
 4. Demonstrate a high degree of proficiency in the use of all studio equipment, especially the production switcher.

- Review of studio equipment, operational and safety procedures
 - The role and responsibilities of the producer
 - The role and responsibilities of the director
 - Improving communication among the production team and solving communication problems in the studio
 - Effective communication with talent and content specialists
 - Developing a sample reel
