Course Title: Introduction to Terrorism

Course Abbreviation and Number: CRI 2580 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will examine the complex and often misunderstood subject of terrorism. Students will learn to distinguish acts of terrorism from other types of violence, study the various objectives and ideologies of historical and contemporary terrorist groups, and learn about terrorist organizational and operational methods.
