Course Title: Network Administration

Course Abbreviation and Number: CSC 2470 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: This course introduces the fundamentals of local area network administration. After a brief review of computer network hardware, students are introduced to and examine leading network operating systems. Students will gain familiarity and experience in the installation, configuration, and management of network operating systems through a combination of lecture and hands-on lab.
