Course Title: Essential Mathematics

Course Abbreviation and Number: MAT 0530 Credit Hours: 5 imputed Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will engage in the study of mathematics for everyday life. This course integrates fluency with numbers, proportional reasoning, percentages, basic algebra, and communicating quantitative information. Applications are emphasized throughout to help students improve their basic quantitative reasoning skills. Students will also learn the value of productive persistence in the learning process. This course prepares students to take MAT 1500 - Problem Solving with Mathematics.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Perform the mathematical skills of arithmetic, order of operations, and solving linear equations in one variable.
- 2. Apply mathematical problem solving techniques to solve real world applications
- 3. Synthesize, compare, and integrate the numerical, algebraic, graphical, and verbal representations of quantitative information.

Topics Covered:

- Productive failure/productive persistence and growth mindset philosophy
- Arithmetic of whole numbers, integers, fractions, and decimals, with a focus on concepts over procedure, effective calculator use, and application/problem solving
- Unit analysis
- Algebra basics such as the language of algebra, simplifying expressions, use of formulas, linear equations in one variable, and basics of graphs in the Cartesian coordinate system
- Ratio and proportion applications
- Percentages and applications
