Course Abbreviation and Number: MUS 1930 Credit Hours: 2 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: This course focuses on rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic recognition and dictation, sight reading, solfeggio, and Kodaly hand signals. Students will have access to computer-assisted practice sessions in the theory studio. Strongly recommended for students wishing to improve their musical abilities. No previous musical experience required.
