Course Title: Foundations of Nursing

Course Abbreviation and Number: NUR 1510Credit Hours: 7Course Type:Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will be introduced to the National League for Nursing (NLN) Associate Degree (AD) Competencies (professional behaviors, communication, assessment, clinical decision making, caring interventions, teaching and learning, collaborating, and managing care), the three roles of the AD nurse (provider of care, manager or care and member within the discipline), and Quality and Safety Education for nurses (QSEN) competencies. Students will provide safe, holistic, patient-centered care to adult and geriatric individuals with diverse cultures experiencing basic disruptions in biophysical and psychosocial dimensions in a variety of healthcare settings. Students will learn the preparation and administration of medications. Select ethical-legal principles are introduced.

Eligibility: Eligibility: Acceptance into NUR program, MAT 1500 or higher; Prerequisites/corequisite: ENG 1510 without supports, BIO 2510.

 - interacting with nursing and inter-professional teams.
 - recognizing ethical-legal principles.
 - recognizing the American Nurses Association (ANA) Code of Ethics

- 5. Thoughtfully reflect on connections between concepts studies in the classroom & insights gained from an applied learning experience/project. [JCC Gen Ed Applied Learning]
