Course Title: Tech. & Enviro. App for Living

Course Abbreviation and Number: OTA 2550 Credit Hours: 2 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

**Course Description:** Students will investigate various high and low tech aids to daily living that can improve occupational performance for consumers across the lifespan. Skill in selection, application, adaptation, and modification of items and environments will be developed.

Prerequisite: OTA 1530 and OTA 1640 with a grade of C or better.
