Course Title: Physical Rehabilitation

Course Abbreviation and Number: OTA 2620 Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will be introduced to concepts and techniques needed to provide care to patients with neurological, orthopedic, and muscular-skeletal conditions. Students will refine transfer and goniometry techniques, while developing skills with manual muscle testing, mobility, and the application of treatment approaches relevant to the physically disabled population.

Prerequisite: OTA 1520 and OTA 1630 with a grade of C or better.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Assess if vital signs are stable for client intervention. (B.3.7)
- 2. Execute a transfer with a consumer following proper and safe procedures. (B.3.7)
- 3. Determine the effects of various diseases and disorders on occupational performance. (B.3.5)
- 4. Design a treatment plan, following the OT process, for a consumer with a physical disability.
- 5. Evaluate range of motion and strength of the upper extremity.

- Sensorimotor approaches to treatment

 - Orthopedic conditions of UE and LE
 - Bariatric factors
 - Arthritic conditions
 - Burns

 - Traumatic brain injuries

Lab:

- Safety in the classroom and clinic including vitals, body mechanics, hand washing, PPE and universal precautions (B.3.7)
- Transfer training
- Bed mobility
- Assessments ADL, strength, ROM
