Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2520 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will continue Painting I experience with emphasis on individual exploration and ideas as well as different painting techniques. Technical approaches are discussed, but the course focus is on the student developing their own images in a personal, distinctive, and effective way.

Prerequisite: ART 2510.

- 2. Participate in critiques of class drawings by contributing commentary on visual analysis of technique and composition.

- 4. Demonstrate in painting knowledge of various approaches fit for intermediate level painter
- 5. Demonstrate in painting knowledge of the approach fit for personal pursuit
- 6. Display understanding of effective compositions
- 7. Utilize texture, value, balance, and unity in their compositions.
- 8. Explore various media to find appropriate techniques for particular themes and style of painting.
- 9. Frame and care for their work appropriately
