Course Title: Printmaking I

Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2530 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will be introduced to the conceptual, technical, and visual elements of printmaking through the creation of work of art. Students gain introductory skills with materials as well as an understanding of printmaking concepts and contemporary concerns. Students will explore sources and subject matter used by artists in their work. Writing assignments and gallery visits will supplement the students appreciation of printmaking as an art form.
