INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Studio Problems-Painting

Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2622Credit Hours: VariableCourse Type:Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will build upon previous studio course experiences in advanced studio production courses under art faculty supervision. Students who have completed the basic and intermediate (as applicable) courses in drawing, ceramics, photography, electronic arts, design or painting, may register for one, two, or three hours of credit per semester in a studio course in that medium. Students are expected to spend two hours in studio work each week for each credit hour anticipated. Studio problem courses are student initiated with each student, together with the faculty member, creating an acceptable course outline and evaluation process for the work of the semester. In some cases, a group studio problem experience may be initiated by visual arts faculty. Students achieving 12 credit hours in art studio problems must obtain permission from the arts and humanities dean to take additional coursework (for credit) in art.

Prerequisite: permission of instructor required.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- Students who demonstrate understanding can:
 - 1. Demonstrate the value of active sketchbook/journal for continuous entries for personal growth.
 - 2. Participate in critiques of class drawings by contributing commentary on visual analysis of technique and composition.
 - 3. Create paintings of personal pursuit: Portfolio pieces
 - 4. Demonstrate in painting knowledge of various approaches fit for intermediate level painter
 - 5. Demonstrate in painting knowledge of the approach fit for personal pursuit
 - 6. Display understanding of effective compositions
 - 7. Utilize texture, value, balance, and unity in their compositions.
 - 8. Explore various media to find appropriate techniques for particular themes and style of painting.
 - 9. Frame and care for their work properly

Topics Covered:

- Discuss target outcome of semester with instructor: Topical outline may include followings:
- Create theme for suit of painting series
- Research on contemporary artist in painting medium
- Create series of paintings with formal continuity
- Create series of paintings with aesthetical tonality
- Develop an effective visual expression
- Documentation and presentation
- Prepare artist statement
- Participation in critique
