Course Title: Adv/Digital/Imag/w/Photoshop

Course Abbreviation and Number: ART 2740

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students' knowledge and skill base in digital imaging will be enhanced through in-depth instruction in the use of Adobe Photoshop. Students will become technically proficient at the capture, manipulation, and output of images using digital still cameras and flat bed scanners. A more sophisticated level of aesthetic understanding will be achieved as students create images that express their imagination.
