Course Title: Introductory Sign Language II

Course Abbreviation and Number: ASL 1520

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Students will learn to interact effectively and appropriately in ASL at the novice-high level with people from other language and culture backgrounds. Students will communicate and reflect upon education, travel, leisure, and storytelling in the Deaf community.
