Course Title: Peace Officer Firearms

Course Abbreviation and Number: CRI 1410 Credit Hours: 2

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: This course is a requirement for New York state peace officers. It is a comprehensive study in the fundamental use of firearms. The student will be provided with detailed instruction in firearms safety, weapons nomenclature, shooting skills, ammunition, tactical situations, position shooting, and use of force issues. A portion of the course will be practical application of learned skills on the firearms range.

Prerequisite: students must be a sworn and properly registered peace officer as required by NYS statute.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Define and differentiate between a "domestic incident" and "domestic violence."
- 2. Identify tactics of control that abusers may use.
- 3. Analyze the interactions of police, victims, abusers, and courts within the criminal justice system.

- Historical police response to domestic violence
- Goals of police response to domestic violence
- Officer safety measures when approaching a scene
- Tactics of control that abusers may use
- Pattern of coercive behavior

- Stalking and domestic violence
- Officer safety and securing a scene
- Primary physical aggressor identification
- Evidence/Building a case
- Strangulation
- Interviewing a victim
- Domestic incident reports
- Orders of protection
