Course Title: Latent Print Level I

Course Abbreviation and Number: CRI 1450 Credit Hours: 2 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: This course is designed to introduce students to the field of latent print work. The course will cover areas such as print patters, SAFIS, Henry Classification System, NCIC classification, fingerprint verifications, criminal procedure laws, major print cases, crime scene procedure, print dusting procedures, print lifting procedures, latent print powders and chemicals, photography techniques, photography of print techniques, mock crime scene work, and a mock trial.

Prerequisite: student must be a certified police officer of a recognized law enforcement agency or by permission of the academy director.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Demonstrate proficiency in fingerprint pattern interpretation; classification, and verification techniques
- 2. Demonstrate the skills needed to dust and lift latent prints through the use of chemicals and powders.
