## MASTER COURSE SYLLABUS

**Course Title:** Hostile Situation Management

Course Abbreviation and Number: CRI 1650 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** Students will how to recognize and resolve hostile situations in law enforcement which includes domestic conflicts, hostage situations, and routine calls for service. Students will also learn how to apply successful coping strategies during stressful conflicts.

Prerequisite/Corequisite: CRI 1510.

- Response to and management of specific hostile situations Officer duties and responsibilities, use of force, domestic violence, hostage situations, civil disobedience, etc...
