Course Title: Serial Killers

Course Abbreviation and Number: CRI 1670 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: This course focuses on the etiology and typologies of the phenomenon of a serial killer, what makes a serial killer, and what impact a serial killer has on society. A cross-section of serial killers is explored, identifying what is believed to have caused these individuals to kill.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or Corequisite: ENG 1510 with supports.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Identify key serial killers.
- 2. Analyze why serial killers do what they do.
- 3. Develop the ability to "profile" a serial killer.

Topics Covered:

- Psychological, investigative, and cultural aspects of serial murder insight into the numerous theories (biological, psychological, religious, sociological, etc.);
- Theories on what makes a serial killer
- Researched transcripts of interviews with killers, and up-to-date information on the apprehension and conviction of the Green River Killer, the Beltway Snipers and other noteworthy serial murder cases.
