Course Title: Computer Hardware & System Software

Course Abbreviation and Number: CSC 1580 Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will study the design, installation, configuration, and maintenance of hardware and software components of a computer. Interior components covered include memory, disk drives, expansion cards, and power supplies. Other common I/O devices and peripherals such as printers and the mouse are studied. Major categories of system software, operation systems, and diagnostic utilities are covered.

- Utility software; operations
