Course Title: Field Placement II

Course Abbreviation and Number: EDU 2220 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture/Fieldwork

Course Description: Students will gain practical experience participating in a minimum of 75 hours of supervised work in a different school or educational setting than they used in EDU 2210. Students will also participate in a weekly seminar which focuses on learning to further develop their interpersonal teaching skills. Students are responsible for assigned readings and a weekly written log of the field experience in addition to other assignments.

Prerequisites: EDU 2210 with a C or better and permission of the education faculty. Application required; must be a program major.
