Course Title: Health/Safety/Nutrition/Child

Course Abbreviation and Number: EDU 1260

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will focus on basic considerations for establishing and maintaining a safe, healthy, and developmentally appropriate environment for young children. Ways to promote good health and nutrition are presented, and prevention and reduction of injuries are explored.

Eligibility: ENG 1510 without supports or **Corequisite:** ENG 1510 with supports.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Analyze and describe the basic requirements for maintaining the health of an individual child and supporting and maintaining that health in a group program.
 2. Demonstrate an understanding of the standard guidelines and precautions that need to be taken and maintained for a safe group program for children.
 3. Describe and explain the requirements of good nutrition for children in accordance with national standards.
