Course Title: Working with Adolescents

Course Abbreviation and Number: EDU 2340

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will explore the characteristics, problems, and needs of adolescents, with emphasis on the techniques and skills necessary for working with them in a variety of settings - recreational, educational, and therapeutic. Topics include a look at treatment facilities, mental health, substance abuse, and the dynamics of delinquency.

Prerequisite/Corequisite: ENG 1530 and either PSY 1510, EDU 1510, or HUS 1210.

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Demonstrate a basic understanding of several theories of adolescent behavior and development applied to specific topic areas, such as adolescent sexuality, substance abuse, suicide, family relations.
