Course Title: Literacy in the Classroom

Course Abbreviation and Number: EDU 2500

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will develop a basic foundation in literacy instruction. The five components of reading, basic reading disabilities, and applications to curriculum and instruction will be explored. In addition, students will examine the basics of literacy approaches including the collection and interpretation of data.

Prerequisite/Corequisite: ENG 1530.
