Course Title: Phlsphy/Tchnqs-Early Childhood

Course Abbreviation and Number: EDU 2510

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will examine the basic concepts of a child's psychological and intellectual development in relation to methods and techniques appropriate to early care and education programs. Developmentally appropriate practices will be emphasized as they apply to the skills used with young children (birth to age 8), individually and in groups. Participation in observations and practice will be required.

Prerequisite PSY 2520 and EDU 2210.

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Apply basic concepts of child development (psychosocial, intellectual, and physical) to methods and techniques appropriate to the care and education of young children.
 2. Read and interpret current research from early care and education publications that apply to methods and techniques appropriate to the care and education of young children.
 3. Select and critique materials, equipment, and experiences for young children in order to identify those which are developmentally appropriate.
 4. Identify and apply elements of an anti-bias curriculum in early care and education.
