Course Title: ELI - Composition I

Course Abbreviation and Number: ELI 0500 Credit Hours: 3 imputed

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will work with simple and complex sentences, guided paragraphs and will be introduced to essay writing with topic sentences and supporting details of evidence and examples. An introduction to expository writing and a targeted composing process is examined. Academic vocabulary is introduced. Prewriting skills including brainstorming and developing supporting details are explored. This course is intended for students with a greater level of proficiency in a language other than English.

Placement by TOEFL, Accuplacer, and/or interview.

- 1. Construct topic sentences with appropriate controlling ideas
- 2. Create simple compound and complex sentences with correct punctuation
- 3. Demonstrate ability to write clear directions (recipe, driving directions, how to)
- 4. Construct paragraphs to describe a person, place, thing, or process
- 5. Use quotations in written passages
- 6. Demonstrate brainstorming by creating word lists, idea maps, or word clusters
- 7. Combine sentences and expand them with modifiers, phrases, and clauses
- 8. Compose narrative, descriptive, and comparison/contrast paragraphs with a topic sentence, supporting ideas, and a conclusion
- 9. Create unity and coherence in a paragraph and among other paragraphs in a short essay
