Course Title: ELI - Reading II

Course Abbreviation and Number: ELI 650

Credit Hours: 3 imputed

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will continue to develop reading strategies to include scanning, skimming, and clustering techniques. Identifying topics, main ideas, supporting details, and making basic inferences are introduced and expanded upon. Coursework will include building passive and active vocabulary from context, introduction of word families, distinguishing fact and opinion, understanding vocabulary from context clues, decoding skills, and recognizing transitions. This course is intended for students with a greater level of proficiency in a language other than English.

Placement by TOEFL, Accuplacer, and/or interview.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Scan for main ideas, specific details, facts, and opinions
 2. Skim text for general topics and identification of text formats
 3. Deduce the meaning of new vocabulary from context
 4. Decode words, maps, charts, and simple graphs
 5. Locate transitional words and phrases
 6. Identify topic sentences and supporting points in a text
 7. Summarize main idea of paragraphs and longer passages
 8. Infer author's meaning from non-literal passages
 9. Demonstrate a full range of dictionary skills
 10. Assess the appropriate definition for new words presented in context
 11. Formulate definitions using a variety of techniques
