Course Title: ELI - Speak & Listen II

Course Abbreviation and Number: ELI 750 Cre

Credit Hours: 3 imputed

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will continue vocabulary building, pronunciation, and intonation continue to be improved upon. Based on student level, the course continues the development of accuracy and fluency in listening and speaking skills including correct word order in spoken English, and further develops life skills vocabulary. Students also will gain assistance in building aural and oral communication skills and focusing on note taking and dictation. There is a requirement of two hours of conversational time each week outside of class time which will be arranged individually. This course also targets academic vocabulary and an introduction to simple gerunds and infinities.

Placement by TOEFL, Accuplacer, and/or interview.

Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Restate/paraphrase target language, especially words and phrases.
- 2. Respond to questions and requests for information.
- 3. Comment on topics such as personal information.
- 4. Practice phonemes and sounds as needed.
- 5. Create a variety of yes/no questions.
- 6. Ask for and give simple advice.
- 7. Describe in the past, present, and future tenses.
- 8. Recall main ideas and some details.
- 9. Converse on personal and academic topics.
- 10. Summarize main ideas of conversations.
- 11. Propose opinions and support them.
- 12. Organize simple oral presentations on general topics.
- 13. Formulate definitions using a variety of techniques.
