Course Title: Literature Goes to Hell

Course Abbreviation and Number: ENG 2660 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** Students will examine various works of literature, art, and music which include the Underworld, Hades, Hell, and the devil. These motifs are examined in a way that refers to the cultures and time periods from which they sprang. These are discussed as literary themes, not necessarily as religious ones.
