Course Title: Planet Earth Field Experience (Honors)

Course Abbreviation and Number: INT 2600

Credit Hours: 1 **Division:** Multi **Course Type:** Internship

Course Description: Students receive research experience consisting of 45 hours of fieldwork activity in a specified setting. Students work in conjunction with a faculty mentor. All guidelines in the original college internship policy will be followed.

Prerequisite: ENG 1530 and a reading score of 80+

Student Learning Outcomes:

A Learning Contract for Experiential Learning is created for each individual internship. In that document, program specific learning outcomes are outlined as agreed upon by the faculty sponsor and the student. The contract must be approved by the assistant dean in charge of the discipline area prior to beginning the internship experience.

Topical Outline:

Topics will vary based on the individual student's educational goals in relation to the type of experience the sponsoring organization can provide. In general the student and faculty sponsor create a learning contract with the following components:

This document is signed by the two individuals mentioned as well as the assistant dean for the discipline area. It is then filed in the division office with a copy sent to the registrar's office so the student can be registered for the course.

During the internship, the student and faculty sponsor will communicate periodically in an effort to create a positive experience for all parties. The faculty sponsor is responsible for evaluating how well the educational objectives are met so the appropriate grade can be assigned.
