# INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Algebra Fundamentals

Course Abbreviation and Number: MAT 550 Credit Hours: 4 imputed Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** Students will learn basic algebra skills necessary for further study in mathematics and other disciplines that involve quantitative problems. Topics include a review of arithmetic and Real numbers, linear equations and inequalities, the Cartesian coordinate system, unit analysis, properties of exponents, polynomial arithmetic, factoring techniques, the quadratic formula, and an introduction to right triangle trigonometry. Problem solving and applications are emphasized.

## **Student Learning Outcomes:**

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Solve algebraic equations by implementing various algebraic techniques and properties
- 2. Apply algebraic and problem solving techniques to solve real world applications
- 3. Use tables, equations, and the Cartesian coordinate system to represent linear relationships
- 4. Factor polynomials using a variety of techniques
- 5. Use properties of exponents and perform arithmetic operations on polynomials
- 6. Implement unit analysis techniques to convert measurements between units
- 7. Work with angles in both degree and radian measure, and use trigonometric ratios to solve right triangles

- Factoring Polynomials
