Course Title: Music Ensembles: Jazz II

Course Abbreviation and Number: MUS 1840

Credit Hours: 2

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will participate in a music ensemble, gain a greater understanding of music literature and styles, and grow in musical expression through performance. Students will perform in the ensemble during a concert at the end of each semester. This course is the second in the sequence and will cover new and different music literature.

Prerequisite: MUS 1830.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Demonstrate proper technique in ensemble musical performance.
2. Demonstrate proper preparation for ensemble performance.
3. Demonstrate a working knowledge of the performance elements necessary for the style of the literature to be presented.
4. Demonstrate proper performance etiquette and responsibility.
5. Demonstrate growth in the understanding of appropriate music literature.
6. Demonstrate improved ensemble performance technique.

Topics Covered:

- Weekly rehearsals culminating in public performance(s) of the ensemble
- Additional training on instrument or voice in an ensemble setting
- Ensemble musical skills and artistry
- Performance practices with regard to music literature and musical genres
- Artistic interpretation of ensemble literature in rehearsal and performance
- Ensemble rehearsal and performance responsibilities and etiquette
