Course Title: Guitar Maintenance/Repair

Course Abbreviation and Number: MUS 1890 Credit Hours: 2 credit hours. Course Type:Lecture/Lab

Course Description: With a major course emphasis on guitar maintenance and repair, students will concentrate on proper stringing, tuning, set-up, and maintenance. Electric, acoustic, and MIDI Controller instruments will be considered. Purchase considerations for new and used instruments will be discussed. No previous music or repair experience required. Application to other stringed instruments will be included as appropriate.

- 1. Demonstrate a working knowledge of at least one element of music production.
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of an overview of structures and terminology for instruments through written examination.
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of instrument design and configuration through written examination.
- 4. Demonstrate a working knowledge of basic setup and adjustments of instruments through projects.
- 5. Demonstrate a working knowledge of cleaning, conditioning, and maintaining the instrument through written examination and projects.

- Overview of structures and terminology for instruments
- Instrument design and configuration
- Proper stringing
- Basic setup and adjustments of instruments (bridge adjustments, nut adjustments, neck adjustments, intonation, string heighth, fret adjustments
- Proper instrument conditioning and cleaning
