Course Title: Fundamental Skills of OT I

Course Abbreviation and Number: OTA 1530 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lab

Course Description: This is the first course in a series of two that focus on development and refinement of skills and knowledge needed for occupational therapy practice. Students will apply the knowledge learned in Foundations of Occupational Therapy and will be introduced to standardized and non-standardized assessments, documentation, and activity analysis. Intervention planning, including concepts of grading and modifying activities will be explored. Students will begin to demonstrate their ability to locate, select, and interpret evidence-based practice research that supports ethical occupational therapy practice.

Prerequisite: acceptance into OTA program.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of the interaction of occupation and activity (B.3.2).
- 2. Analyze an activity using the practice framework as a guide (B.3.6).
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of the OTA's roles, responsibilities, and procedures for administering standardized and non-standardized assessments (B.3.6).
- 4. Determine occupation based interventions that include: promotion, compensation, adaptation, and prevention (B.4.3).
- 5. Identify the necessary components of a goal.
