Course Abbreviation and Number: OTA 2570 Credit Hours: 2 Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will learn skills needed to transition from the classroom to the field. Students will identify Level II fieldwork expectations, explore the supervisory and interdisciplinary team relationships, review professional and ethical behavior, review AOTA, NBCOT and licensure requirements, develop a resume and cover letter, and begin preparation for job searching.

Prerequisite: OTA 1630 and OTA 1700 with a grade of C or better.
