# INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Lifeguarding/CPR/AED

Course Abbreviation and Number: PHE 1731 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture/Lab

**Course Description:** Students will learn the skills of preventive lifeguarding, water rescue techniques, and aquatic facility management for pools and waterfronts. American Red Cross certification in CPR for the professional rescuer, lifeguarding, community first aid, automatic external defibrillator, and waterfront module may be used upon successful course completion. Students will learn to give immediate care to an individual who has been injured, has suddenly taken ill, or has a cardiac emergency.

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

- 1. Identify themseleves as being certified in American Red Cross Lifeguarding, CPR/AED for professional rescuers, and community first aid.
- 2. Demonstrate water rescues for passive and active drowning victims
- 3. Remove victims form the water and provide emergency first aid
- 4. Demonstrate the proper use of an automated external defibrillator.
- 5. Demonstrate the proper use of rescue equipment including rescue tubes, ring buoys, reaching poles, and rescue boards.
