Course Title: CPR for the Professional Rescuer

Course Abbreviation and Number: PHE 1820 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will learn the skills needed to respond appropriately to breathing and cardiac emergencies according to American Red Cross criteria for the professional rescuer, including use of automated external defibrillation (AED) to care for victims of cardiac arrest.

- 1. Identify themselves as being certified in American Red Cross CPR/AED for professional rescuers.
- 2. Describe emergency response procedures.
- 3. Identify life threatening conditions in a victim.

- 5. Describe legal responsibilities in responding to emergencies.

- Responding to emergencies
- Identifying life threatening conditions
- Rescue breathing
- Airway obstruction
- One and two person CPR
- Use of an Automated External Defibrillator for adults, children, and infants
