Course Title: Athletic Participation (Sophomore) Baseball

Course Abbreviation and Number: PHE 2504

Credit Hours: 1 credit hour.

Course Type: Lecture/Lab

Course Description: Student athletes, who successfully complete participation in a NJCAA sport season, will learn about the competitive fundamentals of participation in an NJCAA certified sport. Students will be involved in a variety of learning experiences in the classroom, on the practice field, and during athletic contests. Through hands-on applications, students involved in team sports will learn group dynamics, problem solving, and time management skills. The course of study will focus on physical training and statistical and skill analysis which is sport specific.

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Describe, in writing, their individual athletic and academic goals based upon team goals.
2. Analyze the individual and team statistics that are used within their sport.
3. Apply knowledge of basic rules and strategies of their sport.

- Introduction to proper warm-up/cool-down techniques
- Introduction to sport specific training
- Introduction to competitive sport specific strategies
- Introduction to NJCAA eligibility guidelines
