Course Title: Intro to Labor Studies

Course Abbreviation and Number: POL 1550 Credit Hours: 3 Course Type: Lecture

**Course Description:** In this survey of labor studies, students examine labor history and politics, and the evolution, philosophy, and practice of collective bargaining. Social-psychological principles for effective leadership, team-building and organization are investigated.
