Course Title: Globalize Your Mind I (Travel)

Course Abbreviation and Number: SPA 1601

Credit Hours: 2

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will study Spanish via one on one or small group instruction with a native Spanish speaking instructor. They will explore the social, historical, and cultural richness of the Spanish speaking country while living with a native family and engaging with the local community. Through the language instruction, community engagement, cultural excursions, and independent exploration students will analyze the role they may play and the influence they may have in a diverse world.
