Course Title: Intermediate Spanish II

Course Abbreviation and Number: SPA 2520

Credit Hours: 3

Course Type: Lecture

Course Description: Students will learn to interact effectively and appropriately in Spanish at the intermediate low/mid level with people from other language and culture backgrounds. Students will communicate and reflect upon public and personal identity, contemporary life, and sciences and technology in the U.S. and the Spanish-speaking community.

Prerequisite: SPA 2510; or four years high school Spanish.

Students who demonstrate understanding can: perform the following at the intermediate low/mid-level:

1. Converse with others in person and via technology using culturally appropriate language and gestures on a number of familiar topics using simple sentences and questions. [SUNY Gen Ed – Foreign Language]
 2. Present information orally and in writing on most familiar topics using a series of simple sentences. [SUNY Gen Ed – Foreign Language]

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Topics Covered:

- Theme: Personal and Public Identity
 - How is my identity shaped over time?
 - How do people, places, and events define me?
 - How do people, my culture, and society influence identify?
 - To what extent is my future determined by who I am today?
 - To what extent does age play a factor in society?
 - Who do we respect?
 - Theme: Contemporary Life
 - How does media impact culture and vice versa?
 - How does the accessibility to media or lack thereof impact culture?
 - To what extent does media affect our daily lives and influence our choices?
 - Theme: Science and Technology
 - To what extent do technological advances impact our lives now and in the future?
 - To what extent is climate change altering my lifestyle now and how will it alter it in the future?
