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**MASTER COURSE SYLLABUS**

**Course Title:** Intro to Spanish Literature

**Course Abbreviation and Number:** SPA 2530

**Credit Hours:** 3

**Course Type:** Lecture

**Course Description:** Students will examine representative works of prose, poetry, and drama of the 20th century literature of Spain and the Americas. Readings emphasize the close connection between style and content, as well as the historical and cultural influence of each. Includes lectures, class discussions, and student's written work in Spanish.

Prerequisite: SPA 2510 or four years high school SPA.

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**Topics Covered:**

- The course will include literary works written between the 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries from a variety of Spanish-speaking countries to include: Spain, Mexico, Central America, the Antilles, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Chile, Paraguay, Uruguay, and Argentina.
