Course Title: Theatre Practicum I

Course Abbreviation and Number: THE 1620 Credit Hours: 1 credit hour. Course Type: Lecture/Lab

**Course Description:** Through hands-on application, students involved in mounting a stage production work in teams to learn group dynamics, problem solving, and time management skills. Students will gain a working knowledge in either lighting, sound, costuming, publicity, or props. May be taken for a total of 4 credit hours.

- Building and handling costumes
- Building and handling properties
- Construction the set
- Painting
- Playing a role onstage
- Performing in the orchestra
