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**INSTITUTIONAL COURSE SYLLABUS**

**Course Title:** London Theatre Seminar

**Course Abbreviation and Number:** THE 1630

**Credit Hours:** 3

**Course Type:** Lecture

**Course Description:** Students are introduced to the practice and production of theatre in London, England, one of the world's theatre centers. Following six seminar meetings, students spend two weeks in London viewing theatre productions and visiting theatres, galleries, and museums.

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**Student Learning Outcomes:**

Students who demonstrate understanding can:

1. Discuss a brief history of the origins of theater in England
2. Discuss certain plays and performances attended during their stay in London.

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**Topics Covered:**

- There will be five meetings prior to the trip discussing the history of English theatre and to give suggestions of sites to visit.
- Attendance at certain plays as a group
- A ten page final paper discussing the experience in London
- Review of plays attended
- There will be one final meeting to recap the experience.
