## PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

Jamestown Community College (JCC) and Canisius College (Canisius) establish this transfer articulation agreement for students who wish to transfer from JCC's Associate in Science (AS) Business - Business Administration and Associate in Applied Science (AAS) Business - Business Administration degree programs to the Richard J. Wehle School of Business at Canisius. This agreement specifies the conditions and requirements necessary for those students to be guaranteed acceptance by Canisius with advanced standing into their choice of the Bachelor of Science (BS) degree programs from among the majors listed below:

- Accounting
- Economics
- Finance
- Management
- Marketing

GENERAL GUARANTEE OF ADMISSION AND STANDING
All students transferring to the Richard J. Wehle School of Business at Canisius from JCC must meet the following general requirements:
a) Students with an AS Business - Business Administration or an AAS Business - Business Administration degree from JCC and a minimum cumulative JCC grade point average of 2.5 are guaranteed admission into their choice of BS degree program from the list above. Students with an AS Business - Business Administration or an AAS Business - Business Administration degree from JCC and a minimum cumulative JCC grade point average of 2.0 to 2.49 are also guaranteed admission, but with probationary status. Probationary status may include additional requirements while the student is at Canisius, including mandatory tutoring, study hall hours, and mentoring.
b) Canisius accepts transfer credits only, not the course grades.
c) A maximum of 60 credits will be accepted in transfer from JCC toward fulfilling requirements for the BS degree.
d) In order for a course to transfer the student must secure a grade of C - or better. Grades of D will not be accepted as transfer credit.
e) When a 4-credit JCC course is listed as equivalent to a 3-credit Canisius course, the extra 1 credit will transfer as an Arts and Science Elective or a Free Elective.
f) Students who transfer 60 credits to Canisius will receive junior standing.

## GENERAL GUARANTEE OF OPPORTUNITY TO GRADUATE

Students who transfer 60 credit hours from among the JCC courses listed in Appendix A will have the opportunity to complete the BS degree in four semesters.

With the exception of those transferring to the BS Accounting degree program, students who transfer 60 credit hours from among the JCC courses listed in Appendix A will be required to complete 60 credit hours at Canisius for a BS degree from the Richard J Wehle School of Business. Students who transfer 60 credit hours from among the JCC courses listed in Appendix A to the BS in Accounting degree program may be required to complete 63 credit hours at Canisius depending on the grade earned in BUS 1510.

Students in the BS Accounting degree program at Canisius will receive transfer credit for ACC 211 Accounting Principles I if they secure a B+ or better in BUS 1510 Principles of Financial Accounting at JCC. Students receiving transfer credit for ACC 211 at Canisius will be required to complete ACC 210 Accounting Procedures Seminar concurrently with ACC 301 Intermediate Accounting I. Students not securing a B+ or better in BUS 1510 at JCC will be required to complete ACC 211 at Canisius.

Students who have not completed 60 credit hours from the courses in Appendix A may require more than 60-63 credit hours at Canisius, and may need to attend Canisius for more than four semesters.
