ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUNY CORTLAND B.S. Ed. Physical Education

AND

JAMESTOWN COMMUNITY COLLEGE A.S. PHYSICAL EDUCATION STUDIES

I. General State of Purpose:

This document establishes a formal transfer agreement between Jamestown Community College, A.S., Physical Education Studies and SUNY Cortland's B.S.Ed. Physical Education. Students should note that this agreement does not guarantee admission to SUNY Cortland or to the SUNY Cortland B.S. Ed. Physical Education degree program.

II. Objectives:

- A. To create a seamless transfer process for students from Jamestown Community College to SUNY Cortland;
- B. To attract highly qualified students to both colleges.

III. Eligibility/Admission Requirements:

- A. This agreement is designed for students pursuing an Associate of Science Degree in Physical Education Studies before entrance into the SUNY Cortland B.S.Ed. Physical Education program;
- B. Jamestown Community College students must meet the academic requirements for admission to SUNY Cortland, including specific course work, as outlined in the SUNY Cortland college catalog and in this agreement;
- C. SUNY Cortland recommends that Jamestown Community College students complete a minimum of seven of the ten SUNY General Education requirements;
- D. Jamestown Community College students must complete the SUNY Cortland application process.

IV. Benefits/Advantages:

- A. Junior status for degree and financial aid purposes;
- B. Waiver of the Cortland General Education requirements (not SUNY GE requirements);
- C. Guidelines for completion of Physical Education at SUNY Cortland and direct contact for advisement to promote an easier transition for qualified students.

V. Terms of Agreement

- A. Admission requirement: A minimum overall grade point average of 2.5 is required for admission. It must be noted, however, that Physical Education admissions standards may be significantly higher;
- B. The maximum number of credits completed at Jamestown Community College that can be applied toward the Cortland degree is 64;
- C. Jamestown Community College students must provide a final transcript with their degree designated;
- D. This articulation agreement will be monitored on an annual basis by contact between department chairpersons;
- E. Each institution will be responsible for making this agreement viable and workable for interested students;
- F. Each institution may engage in publication and marketing of this agreement;
- G. SUNY Cortland and Jamestown Community College agree that future changes in the Physical Education program will create necessary commensurate changes in this agreement.
- H. Half of the credits in the major and concentration and a minimum of 45 hours of course work must be completed in residency at SUNY Cortland.
- I. The Jamestown Community College transfer student will complete at least 4 semesters of course work at SUNY Cortland, and can generally complete the B.S. Ed. Physical Education degree in 4 or 5 semesters of full-time course work.
