

Articulation Agreement between Jamestown Community College And Franklin University

Whereas, Jamestown Community College and Franklin University share a learner-centered and community-oriented approach to higher education,

Whereas, they share a common desire to create a seamless transition for the Jamestown Community College graduates seeking a Franklin University Bachelor of Science degree that articulates well with programs offered at Jamestown Community College,

Whereas, the two institutions seek to use current technology to enhance the educational options for time and/or place bound working adults,

Jamestown Community College and Franklin University hereby enter into an Articulation Agreement designed to effect the above stated aims in a manner that will provide the participating student with a quality bachelor's degree completion program.

Jamestown Community College and Franklin University have developed this Articulation Agreement to allow students and graduates of Jamestown Community College to complete a Bachelor of Science degree from Franklin University's distance-education, degree-completion program. Students must complete a minimum of 40 credit-hours from Franklin University.

This Articulation Agreement states the conditions under which Franklin University will accept and apply credits from Jamestown Community College. Transfer Guides, developed specifically for Jamestown Community College, list the courses students and graduates are to complete at the community college in order to maximize transfer.

Jamestown Community College students planning to complete their bachelor's degree at Franklin University may apply to Franklin University at any time during their enrollment at Jamestown Community College.

Franklin University encourages students to complete their associate's degree at the community college before transfer. The student who successfully completes an Associate's degree from Jamestown Community College will be accepted into Franklin University's degree-completion program with full junior status. Franklin University will apply the associate's degree coursework as described in this Articulation Agreement and listed on the Transfer Guide. The student who has not completed an associate's degree but has 60 or more semester hours of college coursework and a Jamestown Community College cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better will also be accepted into the Franklin University degree-completion program with full junior status.

Students may concurrently take courses at both institutions. Each institution will provide student services for students enrolled at that institution. Franklin University will enter into a consortium agreement with Jamestown Community College that will allow students to take courses concurrently from both institutions during a given academic term and maintain eligibility for federal financial aid for all applicable coursework. The Bridge courses listed in the various Transfer Guides are offered on a regular basis at Jamestown Community College, and the Capstone courses are offered on a regular basis online through Franklin University. This generally allows students with the Associate's degree/60 semester hours to complete their requirements for the bachelor's degree (24 semester hours of Bridge courses plus 40 semester hours of Capstone courses) with four semesters of coursework.

Franklin University Transfer Notes

**Both general education and university elective courses must be non-developmental.*

**Transfer credit hour minimums for a 4 hour Franklin course is 2.67 semester hours. The difference in transferred credit and Franklin course credit must be made up in the General Education Electives and/or University Electives sections.*

**For Math Beyond Intermediate Algebra requirement, student may select College Algebra, Calculus or Finite Mathematics. If Statistics is used for this mathematics requirement, an additional general education elective will be required.*

**For the Social Sciences requirement, students must take courses in at least 2 separate disciplines.*

**Laboratory component needed for at least 1 science course.*

**Students are required, at a minimum, to complete 40 hours of non-developmental coursework with Franklin University.*

Algebra Competency Requirement

Franklin University requires that all of our students satisfy an Algebra Competency Requirement. The Algebra Competency Requirement can be met in the following ways:

1. Pass the Franklin University Algebra Competency Test;
2. Take Fundamental Algebra (MATH 150) at Franklin University; or
3. Transfer in Fundamental Algebra (MATH 150) or higher (College Algebra, Calculus, Finite Math, etc., but not Statistics)**
4. Transfer in Introduction to Quantitative Reasoning (MATH 115) AND Statistical Concepts (MATH 215) (For Non-STEM
5. Transfer in Introduction to Quantitative Reasoning (MATH 115) AND pass Statistical Concepts (MATH 215) at Franklin University (For Non-STEM majoring students only)
6. Pass Introduction to Quantitative Reasoning (MATH 115) AND Statistical Concepts (MATH 215) at Franklin University (For Non-STEM majoring students only)
